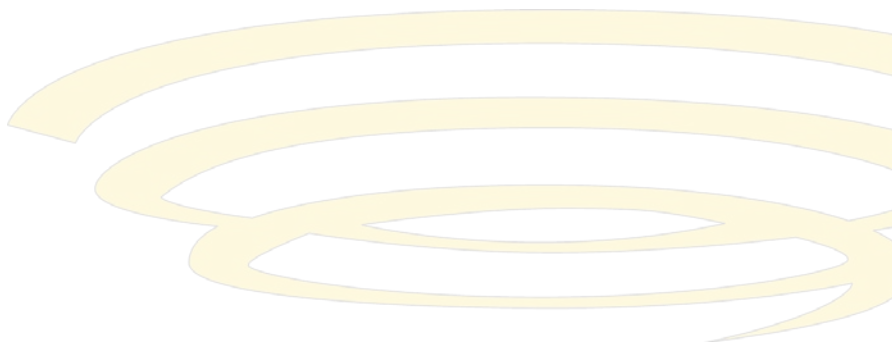


As the Business Development Manager of B&J Marine Services, Inc., I write in support of SCT&E LNG, LLC's (SCT&E LNG) application to export domestic natural gas to foreign nations with which the United States does not have a free trade agreement (non-FTA). This project represents a substantial investment in our community which will promote further business development for both new and existing companies located in Southwest Louisiana.

SCT&E LNG filed an application with the U.S. Department of Energy's Office of Fossil Energy (DOE/FE) requesting authorization to export liquefied natural gas (LNG) produced from domestic sources by vessel over a 30-year term.
