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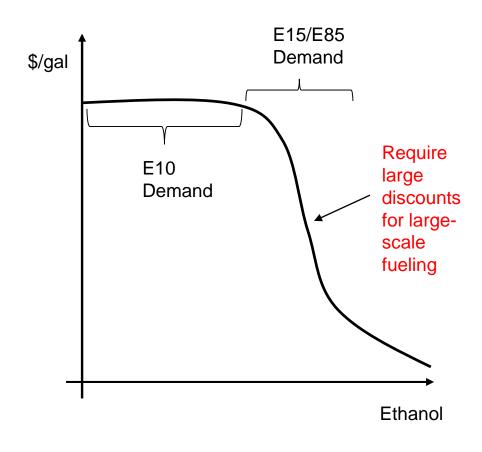

Fact 1: U.S. consumers require price discounts to consumer highblend ethanol fuels (E15, E85)

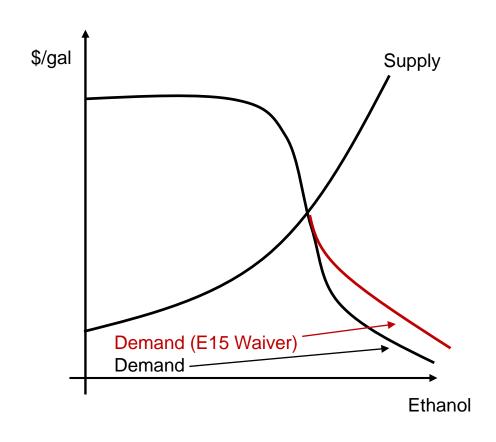






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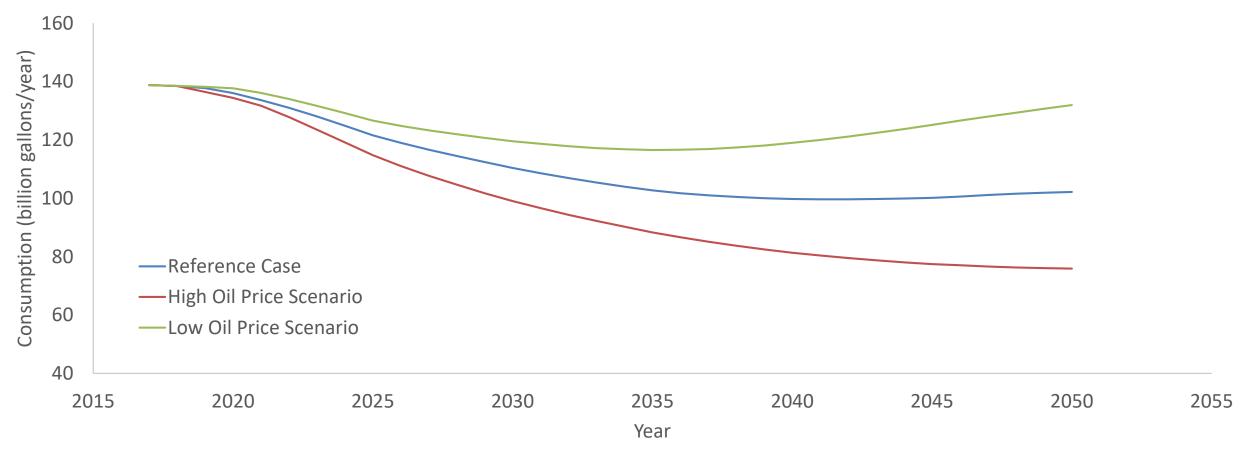




Fact 2: Liquid transportation fuel demand is (likely) declining
